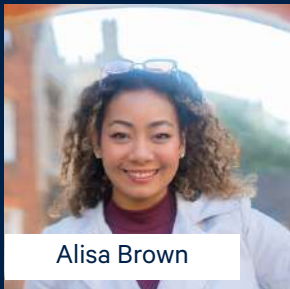




- Accompanying you to formal or informal meetings/hearings you have with the University, College, CCAT or OIA about your case (subject to availability)
