TACKLING SEXUAL HARASSMENT AND VIOLENCE AT THE UNIVERSITY

SUPPORT FOR ALL STUDENTS

The University's Sexual Harassment and Violence Support Service is a safe place for all students to be heard, regardless of age or gender, who have been affected by sexual harassment or violence of any kind, domestic or relationship abuse or stalking at any time.

Our team of highly trained specialist caseworkers and an Independent Sexual Violence Advisor (ISVA) provide free and confidential support and advice that is independent of your college or department.

Our tailored approach ranged from practical support to keep you safe and feeling safe, help with managing the impact on your studies, and emotional support. We are here to support you based on your own needs, at your own pace and whatever choice you make.

The University has separate dedicated advisors to support students accused of sexual misconduct.
