

Bye-Law 1 - Membership of the Students' Union



Full Student Members

- 1.1. In accordance with the Education Act 1994 Section II, all Junior/Student Members of the University of Oxford are granted automatic membership of the Students' Union on enrolment.
- 1.2. Full members of the Students' Union (known as the Student Members) shall be:
 - 1.2.1. All Student Members of the University as defined by University Statute II
 - 1.2.2. Any student on an award-bearing programme accredited by the University of Oxford
 - 1.2.3. And any person serving as a major office holder of Students' Union (Sabbatical Officer Trustees), who shall be conferred student status by the University
- 1.3. Student Members of the Students' Union shall be entitled to take part in democratic processes as outlined in these Bye-Laws including Bye-Law 5 (Conference of Common Rooms) and Bye-Law 4 (Elections).
- 1.4. Student members of the Students' Union may run for and hold positions as outlined in Bye-Law 3.

Associate Members

- 1.5. The Trustees have established a category of associate membership for other Members of the University who are not considered to be Student Members by the University.
- 1.6. This associate membership type shall include but is not limited to:
 - 1.6.1. Visiting students
 - 1.6.2. Exchange students
 - 1.6.3. Some non-matriculated students
- 1.7. Associate Members shall have access to Students' Union facilities and services but shall not be entitled to take part in Students' Union democratic processes as outlined in Article 7.

Ceasing to be a Student or Associate Member

- 1.8. A person ceases to be a Student Member or Associate Member of Oxford SU if they:
 - 1.8.1. Notify University of Oxford or Oxford SU of their wish to opt out of Student Membership at enrolment or any other time
 - 1.8.2. Cease to be either a Student or Sabbatical Trustee
 - 1.8.3. Other than Sabbatical Trustees, are removed from Student Membership in accordance with Bye-Law 8
