OXFORD SU SUSTAINABILITY DEMANDS TRACKER

In November 2022, we asked that every college by the end of March 2023:



TARGET: Adopts a target for net zero carbon and biodiversity net gain at least as ambitious as the central University's 2035 date.



STRATEGY: Publishes a strategy as to how they will achieve this target, with annual reporting, covering scope 1, 2 and 3 emissions as well as biodiversity impacts, and including or alongside a policy commitment to divest from fossil fuels.



ENABLERS: Implements the appropriate governance and enablers to enact this strategy, including a sustainability committee with student representation, and dedicated staff time*.

We are now tracking progress against these demands with a traffic light system, based on information available on college websites:

GREEN: The college has met this demand fully.

ORANGE: The college is making progress to meet the demand and this is visible on their website, or they are meeting part of the demand.

RED: We are unable to see progress on the demand from their public facing website.

*Initially we were only coding colleges green in this category if they have specific staff working on sustainability. Following a discussion with college E&E reps, we can now also code colleges as green if they explicitly explain how they are providing adequate dedicated staff time on the website, even if this is split between different roles rather than being one specific role.
