About the role:

Working Hours:

- Anticipated core commitment averages around 3-4 hours per week during term time, depending on division committee schedules
- Virtual meeting options are available for when in-person attendance isn't possible

What we are looking for:

We are looking for students who undertake responsibilities with an organised and flexible approach and are interested in Higher Education policies and passionate about amplifying the student voice. Attending division committee meetings is a significant part of the role and you will be actively collecting feedback from course representatives and students via formal and informal channels. Prior experience in a similar role is desirable but not necessary, just a strong willingness to develop your skills and collaborate effectively with others. We provide initial training at the outset of your role and ongoing support during your term.

Key criteria for candidates:

 Enrolled as an undergraduate, postgraduate (taught) or postgraduate (research) student respectively within the Humanities Division

- Passion for academic issues and policies, both within the Humanities Division and in the broader Oxford and Higher Education context
- Excellent communication skills
- Ability to collaborate with other reps and divisional staff
- Ability to gather and process information and feedback from students
