About the role:

At the Oxford SU, we are passionate about academic representation. That's why we have enthusiastic students serving as Divisional Representatives (known as 'div reps') from all five divisions: Humanities; Social Sciences; Mathematical, Physical and Life Sciences; Medical Sciences and the Department for Continuing Education (for both matriculated and non-matriculated students). Div reps play a pivotal role in representing thousands of students at a university-wide level, making them vital contributors to student representation.

This position is open to reflect the recent changes within the SU and the University to increase the number of postgraduate divisional representatives. You will work closely alongside the postgraduate (research) divisional representative of the Humanities Division.

The Humanities Division of Oxford brings together nine faculties and the Ruskin School of Art. It offers world-class teaching and research, with an increasing emphasis on interdisciplinary study. The Humanities Division is committed to promoting, celebrating and supporting equality and diversity. Key Responsibilities:

- Attend SU training session
- Attend relevant committee meetings within the Humanities Division
- Attend Student Council meetings as voting members
- Report at Student Council on your work once every term
- Engage in meetings with Sabbatical Officers and other divisional reps
- Actively collect feedback from students within the Humanities Division
- Relay student feedback to the Humanities Division
- Foster connections with course representatives
- Collaborate with fellow divisional representatives on academic issues

Working Hours:

- This is a voluntary role, allowing you to contribute as much time as your schedule permits beyond your core responsibilities
- Anticipated core commitment averages around 3-4 hours per week during term time, depending on division committee schedules
- Virtual meeting options are available for when in-person attendance isn't possible

What we are looking for:

No prior experience is necessary – just a strong willingness to develop your skills and collaborate effectively with others. We provide initial training at the outset of your role and ongoing support from our Sabbatical Officers and the Student Union's Policy and Representation Coordinator.

Key criteria for candidates:

- Enrolled as a postgraduate taught student within the Humanities Division
- Passion for academic matters, both within the Humanities Division and in the broader Oxford and Higher Education context
- Excellent communication skills
- Ability to collaborate with other reps and divisional staff
- Ability to gather and process information and feedback from students
